

# Research Methods

#### **BACKGROUND RESEARCH**

Data collection from a cross-section of sources that included Library reports and the United States Census provided a data-driven view of the Library's service area and its communities.

#### **FEEDBACK BOARDS**

Feedback boards were an incredible resource for gathering information from intentional library users. Children were asked to vote on favorite activities using buttons in jars. Teen and adult crafters used sticky notes to post Makerspace ideas. Simple "yes" or "no" tallies were gathered at outreach events.

#### **FOCUS GROUPS**

The Library hosted six focus groups led by Chelsea Coleman of the Colorado Library Consortium. Invitations were issued to community leaders, retirees/seniors, library super-users, and parents. The staff and Library Board were also surveyed. These small groups effectively and thoughtfully responded to questions about their library and community.

#### **COMMUNITY SURVEY**

Surveys were available in paper form at several events held in the Library and outreach events. Posted QR codes linked to the survey throughout both library locations, as well as on both Town websites and the local newspaper. Survey takers answered general library questions and had opportunity to leave additional comments.


# Thank you


# Community Insights

From April 25 through June 9, our community responded to our online and physical surveys. While the survey is a feedback/opinion survey, it did provide insight into how our communities use our services and resources.

Crafts, Book Discussions, and Cooking were the top three topics that interest our communities!



56.6% of respondents use the library to learn about a topic while 49.5% use the library to learn something new!



#### Frequency of use

Our libraries are frequently used by the community! 48.6% of our respondents visit the library weekly, followed by 32.1% visiting monthly.

Cultivate library outreach to foster relationships with community organizations and businesses.


# Work Ahead
